DAMARALAND

Mesmerizing landscapes

- A place of flat-topped mountains and snaking rivers, acacia woodland and rolling grasslands.
- The rock art at Twyfelfontein, a World Heritage Site known as the greatest outdoor gallery in the world, is home to 5000 carvings and paintings.
- Find desert-adapted elephant, rare mountain zebra, highly endangered black rhino and even lion.
- Private concession areas offer superb day and night game drives, nature walks, game tracking expeditions and stargazing evenings.

ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

A mix of classic and desert safari

- Home to four of the Big 5 (elephant, rhino, lion and leopard), as well as giraffe, cheetah and plains game.
- Etosha aptly means 'Great White Place,' as is dominated by a colossal mineral pan, Etosha Pan.
- During Namibia's dry season (May to October), the temporary water holes around Etosha Pan host animal numbers of biblical proportions.
- The private reserves bordering the park offer the best places to stay.
- One of the top areas in Southern Africa to see cheetah and one of the largest concentrations of black rhino.

SOSSUSVLEI & NAMIB DESERT

Fconic red dunes

- Relax in a sea of contrasting colors.
- Home to some of the highest dunes on the planet.
- Climb Dune 45 or Big Daddy (about 1150 feet).
- Go on a hot-air balloon safari over the desert.
- The NamibRand is Africa's first International Dark Sky Reserve - and best viewed from your bedroom's star gazing room
